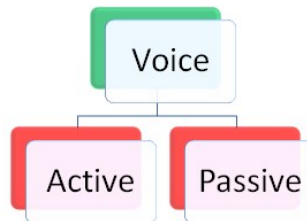
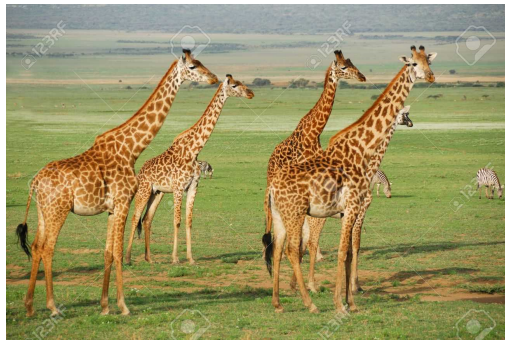


Verb Voice



Active Voice

Active Voice ~ Subject performs the action



Beautiful ^{subject} giraffes ^{verb} roam the Savannah.

The subject of the sentence is performing the action.

The subject ~ verb set is ACTIVE.

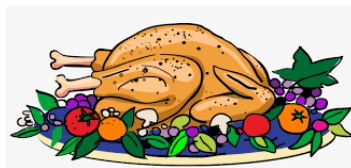
Active Voice ~ Subject performs the action

^{subject} The family ^{verb} bought a Christmas tree.



^{subject} The Easter Bunny ^{verb} delivered colored eggs!

^{subject} Mom ^{verb} cooked a delicious Thanksgiving turkey.



Passive Voice ~ subject is the receiver of the action

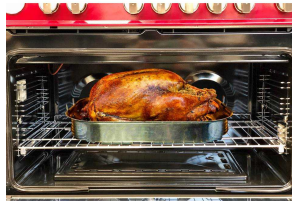


My ^{subject} basket ^{verb} came from the Easter Bunny!

The Christmas ^{subject} tree ^{verb} was decorated.



The Thanksgiving ^{subject} turkey ^{verb} was cooked in the oven.



Passive Voice

If you can add the phrase "by zombies" after the verb and it makes sense, the sentence is **PASSIVE**.

If it doesn't make sense, it is **ACTIVE**.

Example:

The store is overrun (by zombies).

Does it make sense? Yes, **PASSIVE**.

He runs (by zombies) the store.

Does it make sense? No, **ACTIVE!**

PASS

THE BOTTLE WAS RECYCLED BY JOE.


ACTIVE VOICE:

Active and Passive Voice



Active Form:
The professor **teaches** the students.

Passive Form:
The students **are taught** by the professor.

PASSIVE VOICE:
I WAS SHUSHED BY THE LIBRARIAN.

ACTIVE VOICE:
THE LIBRARIAN SHUSHED ME.



PASSIVE VOICE:
THE CRIME SCENE WAS MONITORED BY LOCAL POLICE OFFICERS.

ACTIVE VOICE:
LOCAL POLICE OFFICERS MONITORED THE CRIME SCENE.
