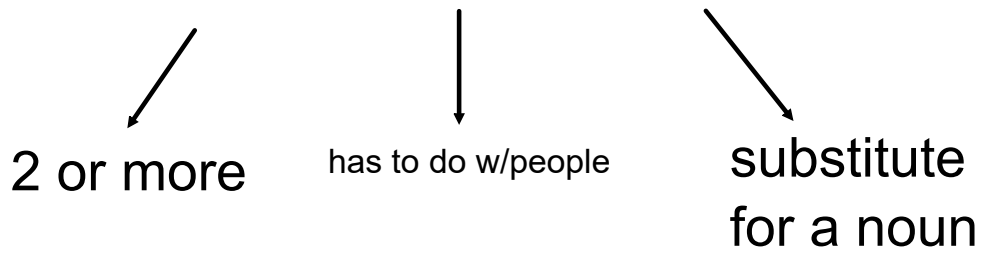
Hint: remove the other person

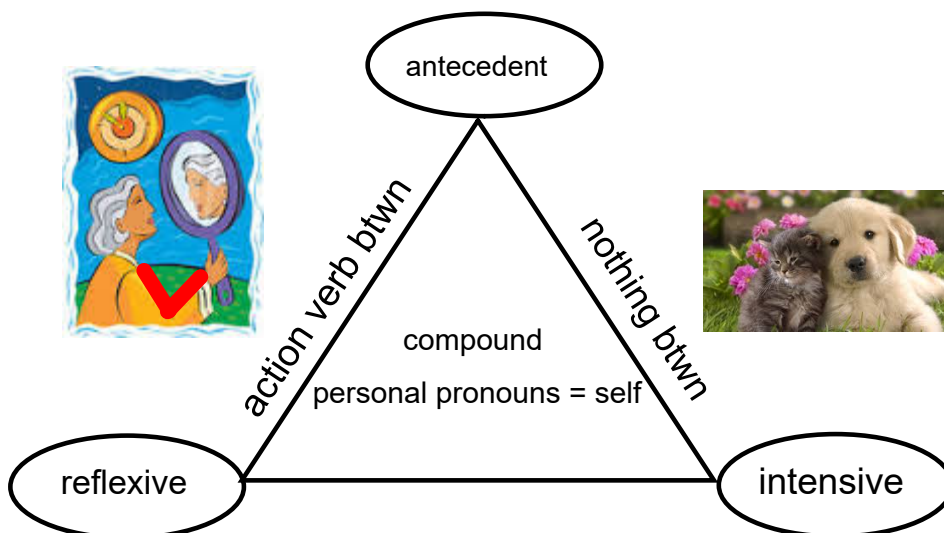

Compound Personal Pronouns "self" words

You **MUST** have an **antecedent** in the **same sentence** when using a CPP ("self" word).

REMEMBER THE RULE!!

You **MUST** have an **antecedent** in the **same sentence** when using a CPP ("self" word).

Please give the paper to either Mrs. Scime or **myself**.

Myself, Susan, or Tom will take care of that for you.

I am very proud of **myself**.

Is something **wrong** with these sentences??

Please give the paper to either Mrs. Scime or **myself**. (me -- no antecedent for "myself")

Myself, Susan, or Tom will take care of that for you.
(Susan, Tom, or I -- no antecedent for "myself")

I am very proud of **myself**.
(This is fine! "I" is the antecedent for "myself")
