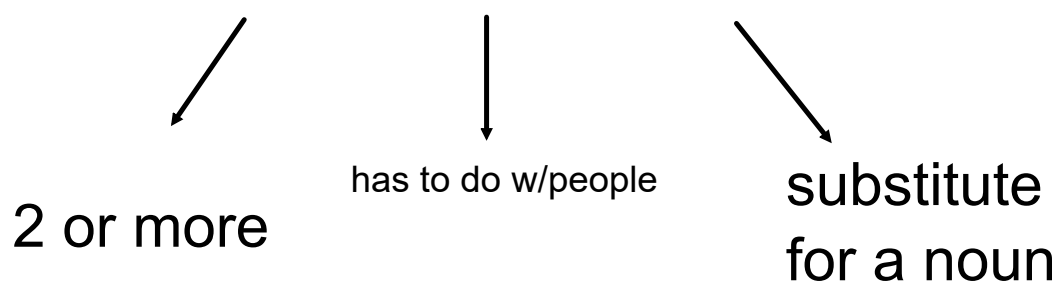


## Compound Personal Pronouns



Intensive and Reflexive Pronouns  
(compound personal pronouns)

"Self" words

Mary made herself a cake.

I myself ate the cake.

Antecedent = who or what the pronoun is referring to

***REMEMBER:*** with compound personal pronouns ("self" words), the antecedent ***MUST*** be in the same sentence!

# Intensive Pronoun

Pronoun follows directly after antecedent

antecedent intensive pn  
I myself baked this cake.

The cake was baked by antecedent Tom intensive pn himself.

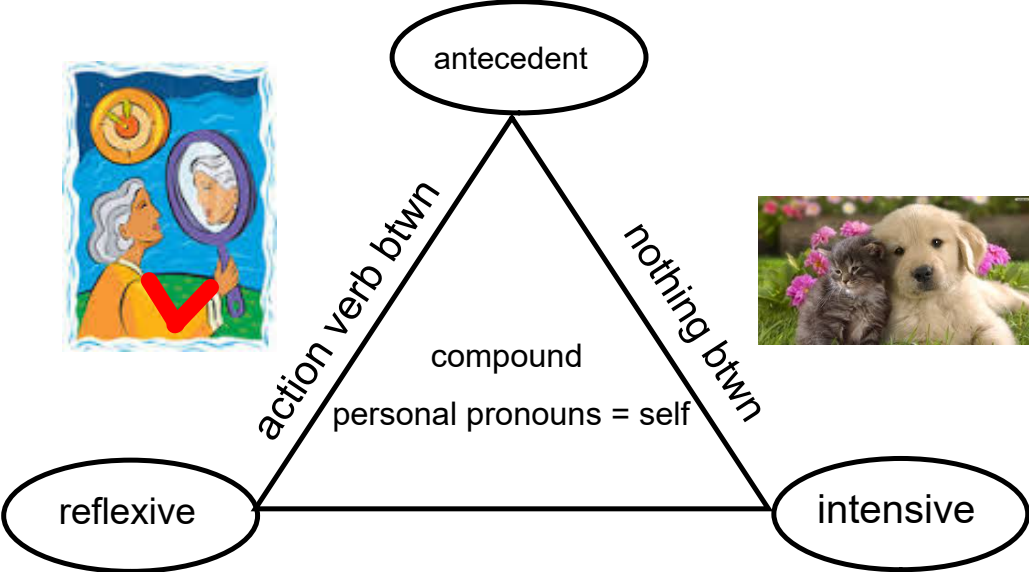
# Reflexive Pronoun

An **action verb** separates  
the **antecedent** from the **pronoun**

**Antecedent**   **Action Verb**   **Reflexive Pronoun**

Mary **baked** **herself** a cake.

I **made** **myself** some popcorn.



Tom and Susan went to the mall. They bought some food and drink. Afterwards, they gave themselves brain freezes with slurpees.

Give the paper to Mrs. Scime or myself.

wrong usage!!



There is no antecedent for "myself" so the pronoun should be "me."
